I. Jesus Courageously Fights A Narrow-Minded Assumption

(Peter Thinks He Can Win Without a Fight)

Introduction: Jesus Announces the Tools Necessary to Win A Fight (Matthew 16:24-26, NKJV)

• 24 Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him **deny himself**, and **take up his cross**, and **follow Me**. 25 For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses



his life for My sake will find it. 26 For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?

- A. You must **deny** yourself (What will you deny yourself to win your fight?)
- B. You must take up your **cross** (What responsibility will you carry to win your fight?)
- C. You must be willing to **follow** (Who are you willing to follow that can help you win your fight?)

Statement: Jesus said these words after a brief conflict with Peter about a fight announcement he made earlier. He was trying to warn the disciples that success would not come without them working through some difficult fight moments.

II. Peter's Response to Jesus' Announcement (Matthew 16:21–26, NKJV)

1. Peter Rejects Jesus' Fight Announcement

• 21 From that time Jesus began to show to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be **killed**, and be raised the third day 22 Then Peter took Him aside and **began to rebuke Him**, saying, "Far be it from You, Lord; this shall not happen to You!"

2. Peter Is Rebuked for Rejecting the Fight Announcement

• 23 But He turned and said to Peter, "**Get behind Me, Satan!** You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men."

3. Peter Learns Three Important Fight Lessons from Jesus' Fight Announcement

- He learned that Jesus **openly embraced the need** for challenge ("...He must go to Jerusalem and suffer...")
- He learned that Jesus **rebuked people who denied** the need for challenge
- He learned that Jesus linked the anti-fight attitude to a **Satanic influence**

Conclusion: You will never advance in your life if you are not willing to embrace three callings

- 1. The call to self-denial
- 2. The call to unfair responsibilities (crosses)
- 3. The call to submit and follow leadership (Who can God send to lead you?)
